Please note that to be eligible as a trainee, a student must be a U.S. citizen or non-citizen national of the United States, or have been lawfully admitted to the United States for permanent residence, and have in their possession a permanent visa at the time of application. Non-citizen nationals are persons born in lands which are not States, but which are under U.S. sovereignty, jurisdiction, or administration (e.g., American Samoa). Individuals on temporary or student visas are not eligible.
